## **How to Think Critically and Problem Solve**

Characteristics of Critical Thinking Wade (1995) identifies eight characteristics of critical thinking. Critical thinking involves asking questions, defining a problem, examining evidence, analyzing assumptions and biases, avoiding emotional

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reasoning, avoiding oversimplification, considering other interpretations, and tolerating ambiguity.

## **Critical Thinking and Problem-solving**

It is not about thinking about a situation or a solution, but thinking about whether your determination is true, false or either or neither. It is more about “thinking about thinking” rather than “thinking about solution”. When a problem may have various meanings, critical thinking is required for you to be able to handle it.
